Executive Council Meeting

30 September 2020

I. Attendance

Alex, Samantha, Avijoy, Kylie, Akriti, Aniket, Dawn, Maria and Ethan were present. Meghan was unable to attend, but emailed updates.

II. Reports

- a. President
 - i. SGA is considering legislation which makes student screen/audio sharing not mandatory.
 - EC members expressed they have not felt pressure to share video from professors. Akriti expressed she liked platforms which gave the option to blur or change backgrounds.
 - iii. Three CNMS students have expressed interest in filling the two open senator positions. Alex will check the GSA email to see if there are any updates from them regarding their applications.
- b. Vice President
 - i. Samantha presented a GSA introduction presentation to international students.
 - ii. FOLIO
 - 1. Website is not reporting heavy use, however the graduate student part of the website is frequently used and seems to be helpful to students.
 - FOLIO is now looking for student feedback from a wider range of experiences (i.e. I have used the website, but did I not work on the planning committee). Email Samantha if interested in participating.
 - 3. FOLIO will be sending emails to faculty members asking how they think improvements can be made for students.

- d. Historian
 - i. Seven of 14 senators have sent program names/pronouns/photos for the website. Kylie will update the website with these seven bios and reach out again to senators who have not responded yet.

- ii. Kylie will set up a "Contact your senator" page on the GSA website with surveys which will automatically forward responses to senator emails (free alternative) before the next senate meeting.
- e. GAAC
 - i. Akriti spoke to GAs about joining the GAAC committee. She received interest from senator Shahin and offered a position to him. She has also heard from two computer science students and will select one more member to join.
 - ii. For the fall semester GAAC will consist of three committee members (Akriti and 2 additional members). If needed, in the spring semester an additional member will be added.
 - iii. Akriti will reach out to Sahara Ali (E-Council GAAC candidate) regarding interest in joining GAAC.
- f. GEARS
 - i. Two GEARS members have been finalized to date. More interested senators will be contacted this week.
 - ii. Aniket attended a meeting with PROMISE last week regarding hosting a joint symposium at the end of November (17 or 18) with the topic *how to get the most out of a virtual conference*
 - 1. This symposium could have a dual purpose: how to attend and make the most of your experience; creative ideas for people planning virtual workshops
 - 2. A panel of people who have attended virtual conferences would be helpful for insight at this event
 - iii. Aniket has been discussing a collaboration with the career center to host a workshop on advising students how to apply for on campus jobs. Date TBD.
 - iv. Alex proposed hosting the Three Minute Thesis (3MT) in January (regional competition is in February), which will require a big push for registration and planning now.
