II. Guest Speakers: [20 mins]

- A. Kevin from ABCEI [10 minutes (6:15 6:25)]
 - 1. Kevin spoke about the work of Alex Brown Center.
 - 2. He mentioned about the various upcoming events, their prizes and the exposure offered.
 - 3. He gave an overview about the ideas that the center has come up with to foster inclusivity, entrepreneurship and to stir innovation.
- B. Sarah Hansen from the Office of Institutional Advancement [10 minutes (6:45 6:55)]
 - 1. Sara gave an overview of what OIA does.
 - She explained about the news pieces they write in the UMBC news and the way they highlight the student research and publications.

III. Special Agenda Items [10 mins]

- A. Graduate Program Fee
 - 1. Amy gave a presentation about the Graduate Program Fee.
 - 2. She explained what the Fee covers and what it is and what it means.
 - She mentioned that the Student Fee Advisory Committee will be meeting on Oct 15 and that 2 senators would be representing the graduate students at the meeting.

IV. Old Business: [30 mins]

- A. Planning for Town Hall (Senators would share their plans in advance and would be asked questions about their plans and progress) [10 mins]
 - 1. CAHSS senators:

- a) Sent out emails to other colleges to hold collaborative town halls but also have plans for inter departmental town halls.
- b) They have a small agenda ready for these meetings and for student interactions
- c) Their targeted audiences are intercultural communications and STEM students collaborating with CAHSS.
- d) They are planning an online town hall in November.

2. COEIT senators:

- a) They have planned a virtual town hall in November and have a set of topics shortlisted for potential discussions.
- b) They have laid down a written framework about what topics they have, the surveys the plan to conduct and other points of discussion.
- c) Their target audience is purely COEIT students.
- 3. CNMS senators:
 - a) They will be holding their Town Hall in October.
 - b) They are planning to follow the past year's template.
- 4. Non-academic senators:
 - a) Cristina tried to setup a meeting for town hall design and discussion but unfortunately Sandesh and Chetan were unable to make it and Non-academic senators are yet to plan a town hall. But they will have one outlined and setup soon.
- B. Motion to establish a special committee on Graduate Student Housing [10 mins]
 - 1. Shahin proposed the establishment of a special committee to explore resources for affordable housing for international as well as needy domestic students.
 - 2. The objective of such a committee is to create a pool of resources, places, renting agencies, localities, links etc so that any student can make a very informed decision about their housing. The committee will not actually look for housing for a particular student.
 - 3. Over time, if this temporary committee is successful, if not a permanent, a yearly committee is worth looking at.
 - 4. The motion to create this GSO was set and unanimously.
- C. Motion to require workshops on equity and inclusion for GSOs [10 mins]

V. New Business: [30 mins]

- A. Motion to establish a Graduate Student Organization for LGBTQ+/Allied STEM.
 - 1. Alex explained why the GSO is the nede of the hour and why LGBTQ+ recognition is required in STEM.
 - 2. Alex and Sabeen gave a presentation about their GSO, their survey and the goals.

3. The motion to create this GSO was set and unanimously.

- B. Motion to establish a Graduate Student Organization for American Statistical Association.
 - 1. Ryan gave a presentation about the ASA and the UMBC ASA Student Chapter.
 - 2. Ryan explained what the GSO's purpose is and who the targeted audience is grads, faculty, and even undergrads.
 - 3. The presentation spoke about the past events, speaker talks, workshops and seminars.

C. Motion to establish a special committee for reassessing the GSA fund distribution and outlining recommendations for ensuring just, fairer, and equitable distribution of the GSA fund that reflect the needs of our diverse community.
