- a) Mail-in Ballot Drop-box will be coming to UMBC, in Commons
- 2. The 2024 <u>Collective Bargaining Bill</u> has been released. The University System of Maryland Coalition will be holding a rally before the State of the State Address at the Maryland State House, to meet all legislators. Carpooling is being organized.
- 3. A member of the LC has stated they would be very interested in acting as a labor union representative for UMBC, likely for a Graduate Labor Union.
- Musa Jafri, SGA President, has approached the LC and the wider UMBC government affairs (including CDCL and OGRCA- Office of Government Relations and Community Affairs) to introduce a SNAP Bill & seeks our support.
- 5. Dean Rutledge informed that there is a bill introduced to change requirements for receiving the Pell Grant and one other. This change would seemingly restrict the number of recipients and prevent more affluent students from receiving it. More information is required.
- 6. OGRCA has informed us there will be a major political debate coming to UMBC, and in April and May it will likely be state legislators running for the open Congressional senate seat. Current Senator Ben Cardin will not be seeking re-election after this term. Other delegates and local officials will likely be invited to participate in the debate. OGRCA and wider UMBC working to engage with and manage the future debate. Possibility it may not happen, and News outlets just buy out the Chesapeake Bay Insurance Area (the Arena)
- 7. Brought on several graduate student volunteers to assist the LC committee.
- OGRCA has plans to take UMBC students to State House in April -May. However, the team of <u>Delegate Edelson</u> encourages UMBC to come during March when it'll be easier to "see the action". LC will be working to invite many grad students when the time comes.
